## Trainee Judges - Rules.

- Training to be a minimum of 2 years, (with no maximum) before any examination.
- All trainees will be instructed on the Australian National Cavy Council Standards.
- Training will be conducted in a professional manner
- Training to be practical, hands on, <u>under the supervision of fully qualified judges</u> and to be carried out in the <u>main breed classes only</u>.
- At no time may a trainee enter the breed classes at a show which they are training.
- Trainees are not to wear white 'judges' coats, other colours may be worn if they wish.
- Record forms of breeds/groups examined must be filled in by the trainee and signed by the supervising judge. These are to be kept by the trainee and submitted when applying for a exam.
- Record forms will be supplied by the QCC Secretary.
- Trainees must cover as many breeds as possible from a 'group' during training.
- At no time will trainees be given the responsibility to award places in any class judged to Australian National Cavy Standards.
- Application for exams can be made after a minimum of two years training.
- Application to commence exams will be made to the Qld Judges Committee, by submitting the training record forms.
- An exam shall consist of judging a full show under the supervision of a member of the senior Judges panel. A full judge's report is to be written after each show. The report must be submitted within 7 days of the show date. .
- Three exams must be completed; each exam must be performed under the supervision of one of the judges Panel, before assessment is made by the judges on the results and feedback on the exam shows.
- The trainee will be advised in writing of the outcome of the exam, within 7 days of the meeting.
